
DIY Dry Erase Boards

Page Protectors


We use so many sheet protectors at BSMART!

Place a piece of card board or card stock inside the sleeve first, then if needed, slip in a white sheet of paper in front of it and there you go!



Dry Erase Tape




If you don't have any dry erase tape, you can use duct tape! **Duct Tape**
